REF: HUGELY, GEORGE (ARREST NOVEMBER 2008)

The events leading up to Mr. Hugelys arrested started with myself and Sgt Frost being dispatched to an unknown 911 call from a Frat house on Jefferson St here in the city of Lexington Virginia. We were both out on foot in the area attempting to locate which frat house the call had come from when I noticed a white male subject stumble into on coming traffic. The male appeared to be extremely intoxicated. I yelled for the male to stop so I could speak with him, he ignored my request and continued to walk to other side of the street in to what we call the "Chapel Lot".

I crossed the road and made contact with the male at which time he advised me his name was George. I asked the male what he was doing and told him I could see that he was obviously intoxicated and if there was someone "sober" I could call to take charge of him for the remainder of the night. He stated that he was not a Washington and Lee student, that he was just visiting and he didn't have anyone to call. At this time I advised the male he would be placed under arrested for Drunk in Public. I ordered the male to place his hands behind his back. He started yelling obscenities and making threats to myself and a female adult probation officer that was with me that night for a ride along.

He used colorful statements such as : ill kill all you b [REDACTED] yall are a bunch of a [REDACTED], [REDACTED] you , I am not doing a d [REDACTED] thing you say [REDACTED] I want to talk to your supervisor now, etc.... At this time I attempted to take control of the subject and restrain his with handcuffs, he started to resist and a brief "tussle" incurred between myself and the male. I continued to tell him to "stop resisting" and he did not comply, he became more aggressive as the situation continued. I had to at this point use my "taser" as a pain compliance in order to get him restrained and under control. Even with my hands on restraint and defensive tactics training, the large male was no match to my small 5 foot 3 inch 130lbs frame. The taser was crucial in getting him restrained. Once cuffed, my Sgt, Michael Frost was on location and assisted in taking him back to my patrol car. He was searched at this time by Sgt Frost and his ID was obtained at which time we knew his name to be George Hugely. He continued to be combative even after placed inside the cruiser. He was transported to the Rockbridge Regional Jail and warrants were obtained for Drunk in Public and Resisting arrest.

Later the following month at this court hearing, I learned that Hugely was so highly intoxicated that night that he didn't even realize a female officer had arrested him or that he had be tasered. To say the least he was very surprised about my testimony on his behavior and actions that night. He apologized to myself as well as the female adult probation officer.
